Short-term housing for adults living with serious mental illness



We offer safe, supportive homes to help adults transition from hospital care to independent living. These voluntary programs provide 24/7 staff support, emergency access to nursing and psychiatry, and three meals plus two snacks each day. Ask your therapist for a referral to get started today.



SMALL CAPACITY GROUP HOME

McKenzie, AL

This 3-bed home helps women with serious mental illness and intellectual disabilities get ready to live on their own. Women can stay for up to 24 months while they learn daily skills and get support in a safe, home-like place.

Good for people who have:

- Trouble with reality or strong anxiety
- Difficulty following medication or socializing

SPECIALIZED BEHAVIORAL HOME

Greenville, AL

This 10-bed co-ed home is for people with mental illness and behavior challenges who are not ready to live on their own. It is a safe, structured place where people can stay for up to 24 months while they get support and learn skills for independent living.

Good for people who have:

- Trouble solving problems or following routines
- Finished hospital care but still need support

CRISIS RESIDENTIAL HOME

Andalusia, AL

This 16-bed co-ed home supports adults who are moving from the hospital into the community. People can stay for 6 to 12 months while they learn to manage daily life. They must be able to attend day treatment programs during their stay.

Good for people who have:

- Difficulty managing emotions, meds, or relationships
- Need a short-term step before independent living
